- 1. **General –** The School Improvement Plan (SIP) for Perquimans County Middle School is developed and approved in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 115C-105.27.

- 3. Our school planning team has developed a lunch duty plan that has been shared and approved according to the School Improvement Plan approval process. In addition, a planning time schedule has been developed, shared and approved that details our progress in providing a minimum of five hours of planning time per week for every teacher.
